

## THE DON MCKENZIE UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

The funds for this scholarship were made available by Sir John R McKenzie in commemoration of his son, Leading Aircraftsman Donald Hugh McKenzie, and Leading Aircraftsman Jack Trevor Villers, who were lost when flying a Harvard machine on active service from Woodbourne Aerodrome. There is also a scholarship available for boys entering Thomas House from primary or intermediate schools.

**NOTE: The current value of the scholarship is not more than \$3,000 per annum.**

1. The scholarship shall be open to pupils of the Timaru Boys' High School.
2. The scholarship is tenable for a period of three years.
3. The winner of the scholarship is to receive an award of not more than \$3,000 in any one year and the number of awards is to be two or more at the absolute discretion of the trustee.

The sum is to be expended upon:-

- Payment of University fees.
  - Purchase of text books.
  - Boarding allowance (if required) at a college or at a recognized University House that is approved by Council.
4. a) University entrance qualifications and NCEA level 3 or 4 performance will be considered for this scholarship.
  - b) To be eligible for this scholarship, candidates must be certified by the Rector of the Timaru Boys' High School to the effect that:
    - the candidate is or has been a member of the first or second fifteen or first or second eleven, or
    - the candidate has gained a first or second place in any of the following school championship finals, or if there is no championship final then has achieved a prominent place in:
      - swimming
      - skiing
      - athletics
      - tennis
      - cricket
      - basketball
    - and that he has taken an active part in leadership in school activities.
  - c) Candidates with academic qualifications only can never win this scholarship, which is primarily for the boys who excel both in and out of school.

5. The Board of Selection shall comprise:
  - the Rector of the Timaru Boys' High School;
  - a senior master appointed by the teaching staff of the Timaru Boys' High School, representing sporting activities;
  - an Old Boy of the Timaru Boys' High School to be appointed for the purpose by the Executive of the Timaru High School Old Boys' Association.
6. The winning candidates may select any of the Universities or Agricultural Colleges in New Zealand to carry out their three years' study.
7. The Council of the University of Canterbury shall from time to time, with the consent of the Rector for the time being of the Timaru Boys' High School, have power to make, alter and amend regulations dealing with the Scholarship provided that no new regulations or any alteration or amendment to any regulations shall in any way alter or affect the main object and intention of the Founder of the Scholarship.
8. The sums specified as maximum sums to be paid in respect of the scholarship may be increased each year so as to ensure that the real value of the awards is maintained.
9. All surplus income from the fund shall be accumulated and shall be applied at the discretion of the Council of the University of Canterbury in extending any existing scholarship for a fourth year or in granting other scholarships for a three year period, or to benefit either scholarship in whatever manner the Council may think fit.
